



## Active Transportation at St. Martin of Tours 2021-2022 school year fall update

Walking/wheeling to school is something that nearly every child can do. It has a positive impact on their physical/mental health, their cognitive capabilities, the safety of their community, and the environment. As a community, we are working with the Daily School Route (DSR) on several projects to get more students walking/wheeling to school.

The DSR is an active transportation system for kids with the aspiration of getting 100% of students walking/wheeling to school on a daily basis. Like any transportation system (e.g. the HSR), the DSR has many components that work together to support the 'vehicles' getting from point A to point B. The DSR works closely with schools to answer the question of "how do we get the **next** student to walk/bike to school?" Then, projects are implemented based on the needs/opportunities within the community.

## **Summary of activities**

Activity	Description
2020-2021 Engagement + reporting	In the fall of 2020, the school community participated in the SchoolWalk survey to identify student travel modes, routes to school, and safety barriers in the neighbourhood.

Safety reporting	In the fall of 2021, through the leadership of the Principal, the Catholic School Council co-chairs, and a class of grade 7/8 students, the safety barriers from the SchoolWalk survey were further investigated to define what changes were required to make it safer for students walking/wheeling to school.
	The recommendations were summarized in a report that will be presented by the HWCDSB to the Hamilton Strategic Road Safety Committee on December 16, 2021.





## Yellow shirt days

We will be starting monthly 'Yellow Shirt Days' to celebrate active transportation. Once a month, students who walk to school can wear a yellow shirt instead of their uniform top. These shirts are available to purchase for 7 dollars. Students must still wear uniform bottoms!!



## Wayfinding signs

In the spring of 2021, the school community participated in a survey to identify the main routes to school. The purpose of this activity was to designate the 'Active Transportation Network' at St. Martin of Tours.

Along the main routes to school, wayfinding signs will be installed to indicate walking/biking times to school from the sign locations.

In the fall of 2021, a group of students walked the main routes to school to determine where the signs will be located. Installation will occur in Spring 2022.
